Class of 2011 Scholar Spotlight: Heading to U of M!

Fall 2011 will see 39 Shiawassee-area students beginning their first year at the University of Michigan.

These students (see list to the left) all received scholarship assistance from the Cook Family Foundation, in addition to merit-based scholarships and/or need-based financial aid from the University. While all of the students have outstanding high school careers, we highlight a few below:



Byron High School — Marisa Kiefer was the valedictorian of her class and the winner of a McAlister Scholarship. A Shiawassee Scholar, Marisa is enrolled in the Residential Collage at U of M.



Chesaning High School — Leo Devota was the valedictorian of his class and the winner of the prestigious Shipman Scholarship that provides \$7,500 per year assistance in the College of Engineering.



Corunna High School — Kevin Davis was a finalist for the Bruce and Jacqueline Cook Scholarship and co-valedictorian of his class. Kevin is an Eagle Scout and plans to major in Biomedical Engineering.



Morrice High School — Cody Mertle was a finalist for the Bruce and Jacqueline Cook Scholarship. A Shiawassee Scholar and Regents Merit Scholarship Winner, Cody is enrolled in the College of Engineering.



New Lothrop High School — Kaelynn Clolinger was 4-H Club President and Odyssey of the Mind Team Leader as well as a Shiawassee Scholar. She is enrolled in the College of Engineering.



Ovid-Elsie High School — Ashlynn Weller was co-valedictorian of her class. An outstanding athlete, she plans to major in sports management in the School of Kinesiology.



Owosso High School — Paige Comrie was salutatorian of her class and a finalist for the Bruce and Jacqueline Cook Scholarship. The winner of a Regents Merit Scholarship, Paige has earned a preferred admission to the Ross School of Business Management.



Perry High School — Justin Krauss was third in his class. He has set several track records and was captain of his school cross-country team. Justin is enrolled in the College of Engineering.



Shiawassee Scholars: A Tradition of Academic Excellence

Continuing its tradition of promoting academic excellence, the Shiawassee Regional Education Service District (SRESD) has again recognized the top eighth grade students in our communities as Shiawassee Scholars.

Shiawassee Scholars, funded by the Cook Family Foundation, seeks to support and encourage the brightest students through their high school careers. The goal is to enable these students to achieve their highest potential and open the door to the most college opportunities possible.

This year, 54 eigth graders were selected as Shiawassee Scholars based on their performance on the SAT (Scholastic Aptitude Test), a test normally taken by high school juniors and seniors for college admission. Shiawassee Scholars (listed on this page) each receive a \$500 scholarship to be applied to an academic enrichment program. Additional funds are competitively available to help pay for more expensive summer programs or for those in financial need.

Students have used their scholarships for accelerated math and English programs at Michigan State and University of Michigan, for summer programs in music and engineering, to explore career opportunities such as medicine and law, to travel abroad with study programs and for a variety of other academic endeavors.

In addition to scholarships, the Shiawassee Scholars are supported throughout high school with workshops, extra counseling and field trips to Big Ten Universities.
