




OUR VISION:

We remain committed to education in the Shiawassee region, providing funding for preschool programs, student support, and college scholarships.

Our board also continues to look for opportunities to expand community education, address the needs of our youth, and create more opportunities for women in education, the economy, civic leadership, and community development. We always urge community members to reach out to us with their best ideas to help us realize our vision to create diverse, sustainable, and thriving communities welcoming to all.



We are fortunate to live in communities often defined by the Shiawassee River and we extend our environmental grant-making to its watershed and surrounding areas.

In particular, we seek to make investments to protect the land we all depend on, which includes both natural areas and working agricultural lands. 

To honor their long-term commitment to youth, the Foundation is joining the Shiawassee Family YMCA's \$2.5 million capital campaign to revamp their facilities and add childcare services to their programs that serve the community. The Foundation has made a legacy donation and offered a \$500,000 challenge grant to match pledges of \$20,000 or more to the campaign. Foundation Trustee, Anna Owens, is co-chair of the campaign, and several Cook family members and friends have also stepped up to be part of the effort.

Bruce Cook, like his father Don before him, was an advocate for the Shiawassee Family Y. Jackie Cook, in addition to serving as an elected board member of the Owosso Public Schools, helped launch the Foundation's work in early childhood education.

The most recent benefactors to the Cook Family Foundation invested their time
